WINING IN GREECE!

Wine tasting in Greece used to mean trotting down to a guy in your neighborhood who had a few barrels of Retsina in his basement or storage room.

Sometimes you could even choose between retsina, unresinated white wine and kokkinelli (a rose wine). Lots of this Hima (unbottled) wine was very good and Chardonnay or Cabernet Sauvignon was far from our minds!

Nowadays, it looks as though Attica's retsina does not exist anymore! Young men and women, most of them educated abroad, have transformed their family press into a state-of-the-art winery with the latest equipment.

This tour will give the client a good insight into the modern wine industry of Greece.

10-DAY-PROGRAM

Day 1, Arrival in Athens and transfer to the hotel.

Depending on flight, free for the rest of the day. Get to know this magic city and its turbulent life, which never seems to stop!

In the late afternoon, we will have our first experience with a visit of the Megapanos winery. Mr. Megapanos, one of the leading experts and president of the Attica Winemakers Association, will give a lecture about what you will be visiting the next coming days and about wine producing in Greece in general.

Dinner will be in a local restaurant – taverna : "To Chani tou Skorda" Return to the hotel and overnight.

Day 2, Breakfast at the hotel.

We will start the day with a ½ day city tour of Athens with professional English speaking guide, including a panoramic tour of Athens (Constitution Square, the House of Parliament, the Memorial of the unknown Soldier, the National Library, the Presidential

Palace, the Panathenaic Stadium) and visit to the Acropolis, with the most famous monuments such as the Temple of Nike, the Erechteion, the Parthenon and the Museum.

Free lunch in Plaka.

After lunch, we will continue the tour with a visit of the **Semeli-Kokotos estate**. Mrs. Anne Kokotos (British) will introduce you into the wine making and the most important products. The estate is as well renowned for its marvelous view.

Back to Athens.

Dinner tonight at "Archaion Gevseis":

We invite you to enjoy the gastronomical preferences of our ancestors with old recipes (lost during centuries).

The food, served by the ancient way, is surprising and very healthy, an unforgettable gastronomical experience.

The whole environment and organization of the restaurant is a complete revelation, from the interior design until the dresses of the waiters.

All the plates of Archaion Gevseis are based on ancient recipes and with whatever was available in ancient times (no forks are used!).

The information is printed as a newspaper "The Ancient news", in which the client can find the menus, the ancient sources and stories as well concerning the daily life in classical Greece.

Return to the hotel and overnight



Day 3, Breakfast at the hotel.

Today, we will explore Attica. Together with our guide, we will drive through the mainland (inner road) in order to arrive at **Ktima Vassiliou**. This third generation of wine makers has accomplished to produce very good wines and you will be able to taste them.

The visitors' program includes: guided tour of the winery and the cava, slide show with explanation of the production, lunch in the winery together with the tasting of 4 different wine products.





After this, we will slowly proceed to Cape Sounion, one of the most visited spots of the Attic mainland, for a guided visit of the Poseidon temple.

Return to Athens and dinner on the road in one of the famous fish taverns of Palaia Phokaia or at Kastellorizo in Varkiza. Overnight at the hotel.

Day 4,



Breakfast at the hotel.

Departure for a tour of the Peloponnese with our professional English speaking guide.

We will leave Athens by the coastal road to the Corinth canal (short stop for photo's and coffee).

Continue to Nemea, the region known for its quite heavy red wines (once known as Hercules'

Blood). Visit of the **Skouras estate**, producer of the finest wines.

Lunch on the road.

Continue to Epidauros (best preserved ancient theatre of the ancient world) and Mycenae (Cyclopic walls, lions' gate) for a guided visit of these 2 archaeological sites.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel in Nafplio.



Day 5, Breakfast at the hotel.



In the morning we will visit the region of Mantinea, another interesting wine region. 2 estates are on the program: **Spyropoulos and Tselepos Estate**, 2 old mansions transformed into modern wineries.



Lunch in local taverna.

After lunch, we will continue. On the road to Olympia, we will visit the archaeological site of Bassae with the temple of Apollon Epikourios, one of Greece's best preserved shrines.



Overnight and dinner at the hotel in Olympia.

Day 6,



Breakfast at the hotel.

In the morning, visit of the archaeological site of Ancient Olympia, the cradle of the Olympic Games (the temple of Olympian Zeus and the museum).

Lunch on the road

After the guided visit, we will continue to the Mercouri estate, a beautiful

villa with gardens, tastefully preserved and stunningly landscaped. The owners are very intelligent people and fine experts in their field.

Dinner and overnight at Porto Rio Resort, not far away from Patras.

Day 7, Breakfast at the hotel.

We will continue our exploration, driving to the **Oenoforos estate**, where we will taste one of the white wines, originating from the slopes of the mountains facing north towards the Gulf of Corinth (this region has a unique microclimate advantageous for grape growing). After the visit we will continue to Diakofto, where we will take the famous cog-wheel train, which will bring us through the Boraic gorge to reach Kalavryta. Lunch in Kalavryta and free time (or visit to the "Cave of Lakes". Return to Patras, dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Day 8, Breakfast at the hotel.

In the morning, visit of the **Achaia Claus winery**, one of the most important Greek wineries.

After lunch, we will cross the newly built bridge from Rio to Antirrio and climb up to Delphi with a visit of the archaeological site and its museum with the famous bronze statue of the charioteer.



Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Day 9,



Breakfast at the hotel.

After breakfast, we will leave for the **Hadzimichalis estate.** The owner played an important role in altering the face of the Greek wine industry in the early 1980's. Now, Hadjimichalis has become a household name in Greece and producers of some of the most remarkable wines. Lunch on the road.

Return to Athens and overnight at the hotel.

Day 10,

Breakfast at the hotel.

Free until transfer to the airport.
